AMCS continues to break new ground!

Last year, we were proud to unveil our new LGBT Affirmative Therapy Center, which specializes in psychotherapy for lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender folks. The new center makes AMCS one of the few clinics in Los Angeles and the only one in the area specializing in services specifically geared toward the LGBTQIA population.

The clinic currently has more therapists in training, 60, than

ever before and, in partnership with Antioch University, the clinic will put on a continuing education course for licensed mental health professionals on working with Transgender and Gender Non-binary Clients in March. We are truly dedicated to educating the next generation of mental health professionals.

On the program side, we are excited to be expanding our At-Risk Kids Program, enabling us to help even more local students, and we're always looking to create new

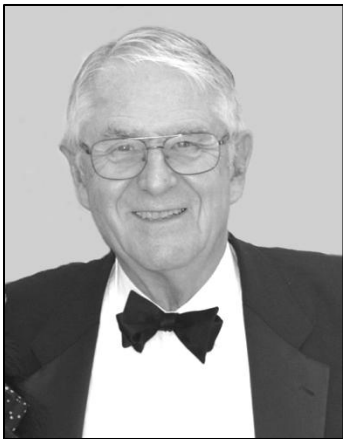
programs to match the needs of our community. Last year, for example, we were pleased to offer a very successful free group titled "Happy Holidays" for people who needed some additional support around the holidays.

He notes that his cruise trips rarely require tuxedos anymore, which is good because he has noticed that it doesn't fit as well as it used to fit, perhaps due to another of his volunteer activities. **Annual Meeting**

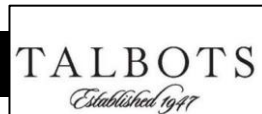
This year's Westchester Mental Health Guild **Annual Spring Meeting** is scheduled for **May 15, 2019 at 11:30am** at Covenant Presbyterian Church. Our guest speaker is **Nicole Barkopoulos**, who will be discussing the stressful transitional period of the aging adult population using meaning-centered therapy.

Nicole is a Marriage and Family Therapy Associate who has been at AMCS for 2 years. She has had the opportunity to train in the Initial Consultation track, the Immediate Intervention track, worked with youth and currently runs groups for the clinic. She has facilitated the Self-Esteem Group, the Medication Support Group, the Holiday Group, and will be starting the 50+ Know Your Why Group. She currently works at a Crisis Residential Treatment Program as the therapist on staff providing case management and therapy from a Trauma-Informed perspective.

Nicole's long term goals are to work with the underserved young adult population, assisting them through that stressful, transitional period of their lives where many mental health disorders tend to surface, as well as doing the same for the aging adult population. *"I plan to incorporate meaning-centered therapy no matter what population I work with, as finding meaning can help us all through both terrible and wonderful times."*
